Welcome

Firstly let me welcome you to the Junior Premier League.

The Junior Premier League's main aim is to develop players for the highest level of football possible. That may be a professional academy or centre of excellence or it may be post school year 11 moving into a college style football academy scheme; or post school year 13 into a USA soccer scholarship.

Part of a player's development is playing in the right environment – this is why the Junior Premier League enforce that all of the players in this league work with appropriately qualified coaches. It is also why we are a Respect League and have a very strict Code of Conduct that applies to any person attending or being involved in a Junior Premier League match.

We want you to enjoy all of your matches played in our League and want to make the experience fair for everyone whilst being competitive. Please make sure you and the player have read (and anyone else who will regularly attend matches) the Code of Conduct and understand its contents – any queries please contact us via enquiries@junior-premier.co.uk

We would like to remind you of some rules that exist within the League that are important to the smooth running administratively of the competition. These rules also protect your son and any non-adherence from a club must be reported to the League.

- 1. Contract players, as defined in Football Association Rules, are not permitted in this Competition. A contract player may only play for the Club that holds his contract.
- 2. It is the responsibility of each Club to ensure that any Player signing a registration form for that Club has, where necessary, the required International Transfer Certificate. Clearance is required for any Player aged 12 and over crossing borders including Wales, Scotland and Ireland.
- 3. A fee of £7.50 shall be paid for each player registered (this may be paid by your club or already be a part of your signing on fees please check with your club how this is being paid).
- 4. A player cannot take part in a Junior Premier League competitive match without his registration being validated by the registrations secretary. Failure to comply with this will mean that the club is charged with playing an unregistered player and the result will be forfeited by the offending club.

As a league that promotes development over results we expect all teams to give each player a minimum of 50% playing time **per game**. Any non-adherence from a club must be reported to the League.

We will also require proof of a player's age for registration purposes. We will accept preferably a passport or an original birth certificate or photocopy. In cases where the passport or birth certificate is not available we will require a photocopy of another official document issued by a Government Agency attesting to the player's date of birth. Proof of identification is only required for brand new registrations or registrations previously not validated.

A player having taken part in matches for any Club affiliated to any County Football Association shall not be allowed to join, be transferred to, or sign for a Club in the Competition without first proving to the officials of the intended Club that the player has discharged all reasonable financial liabilities, including the return of any kit, to the previous Club or Clubs, and a Club official may not accept such player's signature without first ascertaining whether such claims have been discharged to the satisfaction of the Club, or Clubs, for which the player last played.
